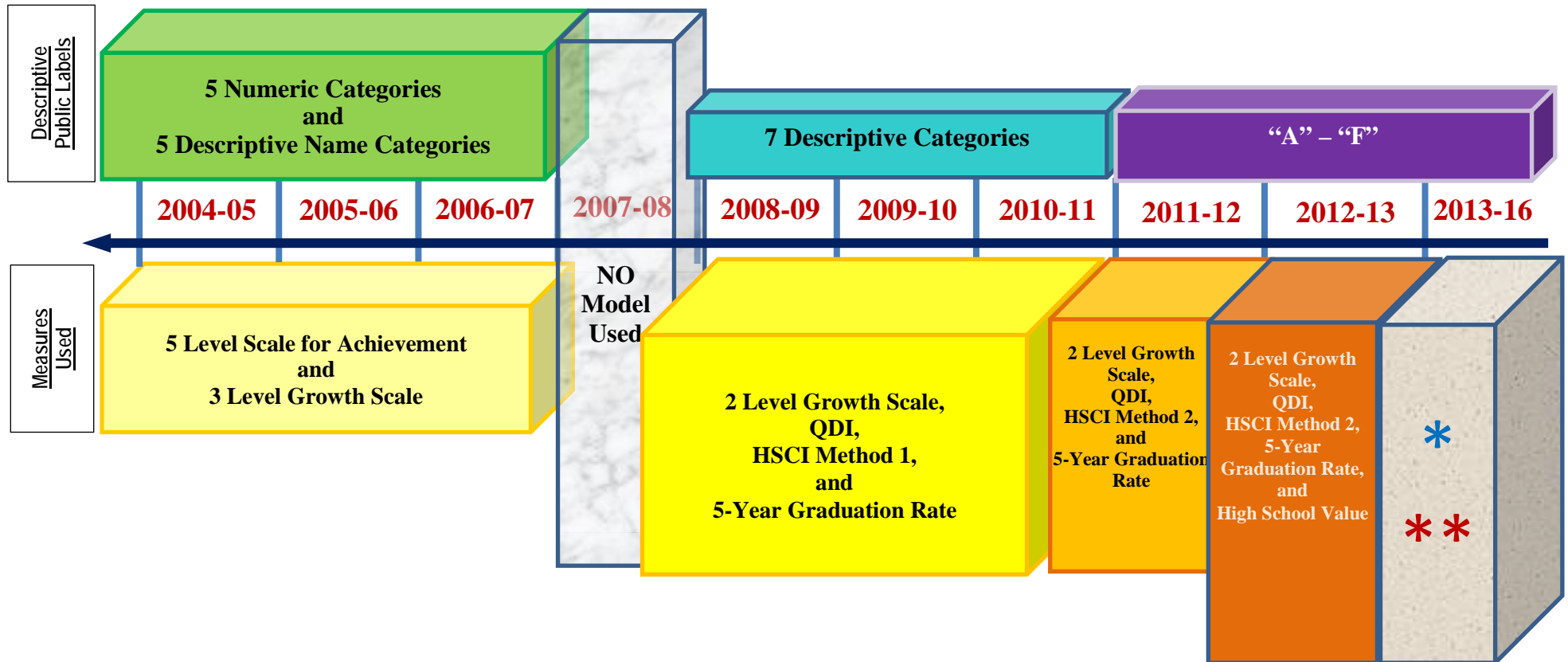


A 12-Year Overview of District Accountability System Changes 2004-2016



* The 2013-2014 algorithm employs up to ten new/different measures other than what is shown in the chart above. None of these measures was used in any previous year.

** Recently, the US Department of Education appears to have rejected the latest iteration of the accountability model, thus potentially forcing more changes

The **Quality of Distribution Index (QDI)** is a measurement of student performance on a particular day; QDI doesn't consider past performance. QDI measures how well schools are moving students between proficiency levels (i.e. "crossing the bar".) The formula for the Quality of Distribution (QDI) is: $QDI = \% \text{ Basic} + (2 \times \% \text{ Proficient}) + (3 \times \% \text{ Advanced})$; The QDI can range from a low of "0" to a high of "300"

High School Completion Index (HSCI). This has changed as the State has expanded the various ways a student can graduate
